For the 2021-22 school year, schools were identified using definitions and labels as required in the Every Student Succeeds Act (ESSA). A Targeted Support and Improvement (TSI) school is one that has at least one underperforming student subgroup. An Additional Targeted Support (ATS) school is one that has a student subgroup performing at the same level as the lowest 5% of all schools in the state. A Comprehensive Support and Improvement (CSI) school is one whose performance is in the lowest 5% of all schools in the state or has a graduation rate at or below 67%. Some schools are not identified with any of these labels. In these cases, no label is given. Lorenz C. List Elementary School did not receive a label, but was named a Reward School.

State law requires that we also report additional information. On the following pages, you will find information about our programs and opportunities, our school's enrollment, School Improvement Plan, Curriculum, Achievement Results, and more.

PROCESS FOR ASSIGNING PUPILS TO THE SCHOOL

Since there is only one elementary building in this district that serves this grade span of pupils, all district pupils in kindergarten through fourth grade are assigned

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to List Elementary School. List Elementary School accepts School of Choice applicants as announced annually. Applications are due during the appropriate timeframes for acceptance.

THE STATUS OF THE 3-5 YEAR SCHOOL IMPROVEMENT PLAN

In 2019-20 Frankenhuth Schools ended its accreditation with NCA, and in 2020-21 and 2021-22, streamlined efforts toward "school improvement" using the newly released Michigan Integrated Continuous Improvement Process (MICIP). Still in the implementation phase, this process was initiated by the state of Michigan with the expectation for schools and districts to unify their plans and initiate these efforts with a goal that strives to improve student outcomes by assessing whole child needs to develop plans and coordinate funding. This process ultimately encourages the continuation of what had been in place with our prior NCA accreditation, including focusing on high levels of student achievement, a positive school climate supporting the educational process, and a shared mission among all stakeholders. We will focus our continued growth on meeting the needs of the whole child by incorporating the use of research-based best practices in socio-emotional and academic learning and development. Our specific academic focus areas include increasing performance and minimizing the achievement gap in reading, writing, and mathematics/critical thinking. All of our school improvement goals and strategies are in the "monitoring" phase of the process, with annual revisions to improve results.

A BRIEF DESCRIPTION OF OUR SCHOOL & SPECIALIZED PROGRAMS

List Elementary School serves 485 students in Young 5's through fourth grade. We have twenty-seven full-time teaching staff members and one Literacy Coach. There is also a full-time daycare and an ever-expanding preschool program.

CORE CURRICULUM

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The Frankenmuth School District offers a core academic curriculum as defined by the State of Michigan. The educators at List Elementary are involved in the on-going, cyclical process of research, analysis of current practice, and selection of appropriate materials, resources, and implementation.

English Language Arts

The English Language Arts curriculum follows Michigan approved Common Core State Standards. Building educators utilize the Lucy Calkins Units of Study in Reading, Writing, and Phonics and the Literacy Footprints Guided Reading series.

Mathematics

Building educators utilize Engage New York mathematics program. The Focused Instruction in Mathematics model from the Institute for Excellence in Education is also used.

Science

Building educators utilize the Mystery Science program to provide instruction that is aligned to the Next Generation Science Standards approved by Michigan's State Board of Education.

Social Studies

The Social Studies curriculum follows the Grade Level Content Expectations approved by Michigan's State Board of Education.

AGGREGATE STUDENT ACHIEVEMENT RESULTS, INCLUDING CREDIT EARNING

Our kindergarten through fourth grade students are given the Measures of Academic Progress (MAP) tests to determine each student's instructional level in Math and Reading three times per school year. MAP tests are computer based and unique in that they adapt for each child's level of learning. MAP tests are administered three times each school year (fall, winter, and spring).

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Our kindergarten through fourth grade students are also assessed on reading skills through the Fountas and Pinnell Benchmark Assessment System 3-4 times per year. These data, along with other classroom assessments and observations, help our staff make informed decisions regarding individual student academic needs.

The Focused Instructional Model mathematics program tests students' progress on targeted mathematics standards. Students are progress monitored every two-weeks and tested 3 times per year over these standards.

The following chart reflects the NWEA scores of our kindergarten through fourth grade students for the fall of 2021 to the spring of 2022.
