Common supplies for the first day are something to write with and something to write on. Additional needs will be shared on the first day of school.

Pro Tip: students with more than one class listing "binder" needs may be able to use one larger binder and dividers for multiple classes and ease of carry.

Building access for **locker set up** will be available beginning on Weds. August 23 after noon and on Thursday, Aug. 24, as well as Monday, August 28, Tuesday, Aug. 29, and Thursday, Aug. 31 from 9am

- 1pm daily (Skyward opens w/locker # and com. info on Wed. Aug. 23 around noon).
